## WHAT PROGRAMS WE OFFER

### **Educational Advocacy**

An Educational Advocate is a parent of a child with a disability and (nationally certified through COPAA) works with parents by assisting them in getting their children's special education needs met at school. An Advocate will provide information to parents about their rights, disability laws and school procedure in an effort to empower parents and guardians to effectively advocate on behalf of their children and youth. Advocates will attend school meetings with families to ensure the family voice is heard and considered in the IEP (Individual Education Plan) or 504 process. Advocates encourage parents to involve their children/youth in the decision-making process to promote self-determination.

### Partnership with Families (PWF)

The PWF Program uses a wraparound philosophy with System of Care Values and Principles to support families that have children with mental health and behavioral health challenges. F.A.C.T. works in conjunction with Compass Health to support these families in their homes and community. F.A.C.T. provides a nationally Certified Family Peer Specialist (CFPS) and uses a peer support model which means that all Parent Support Partners have a child with a disability themselves. Because we have been through the process and "walked the walk" we are able to support other parents/guardians through their journeys. Our main goal is to help families navigate systems, empower them, and build their resiliency so that they can handle any situation that may arise.

## **Family Support Program**

The FSP Program uses a wraparound philosophy with System of Care Values and Principles to support families that have children with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. F.A.C.T. FSP's support these families in their homes and the community. F.A.C.T. provides a nationally Certified Family Peer Specialist (CFPS) and uses a peer support model which means that all Family Support Partners have a child with a disability themselves. Because we have been through the process and "walked the walk" we are able to support other parents/guardians through their journeys. Our main goal is to help families navigate systems, empower them, and build their resiliency so that they can handle any situation that may arise.

#### **People First**

People First is an adult self-advocacy & self-help organization run by & for adults 18 years and older who have Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. People First teaches, mentors, coaches, guides & prepares adults to advocate for change in their community, state, and federal laws.



## **Dees Scholarship Fund**

The Dees Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of John & Katie Dees who were both special education teachers in the Francis Howell School District. They perished in a house fire along with their daughter in 1987.

The Dees Scholarship is awarded through F.A.C.T. in conjunction with the Francis Howell Dees Scholarship Committee. Each year, one special education student is selected to receive a \$1,000 scholarship to further their education & help them continue their quest in becoming an integral, productive member of society.

## **SERVICES FISCAL YEAR 2022**

#### Partnership with Families Empowerment Activities

 Adopt-A-Family - F.A.C.T. worked with the Franklin County Community Resource Board (FCCRB) to provide holiday gifts to 51 eligible children



• **No Hunger Holiday** – F.A.C.T. worked with the Harvester Knights of Columbus in Cottleville to get complete Thanksgiving dinners to almost 300 of our families in the PWF and Family Support Program.

• Back-to-School – Thanks in part to donations from Safety National & grants received by the Harmon Foundation & Franklin County Community Resource Board F.A.C.T. provided a "Back to School" pool party in St. Charles, Warren, Lincoln, Franklin & St. Louis Counties, and St. Louis City. We also gave away 860 backpacks filled with necessary school supplies to our PWF & FSP families.



- People First The People First group's membership had 74 members.
- **Direct Educational Advocacy & Transitions** Provided advocacy assistance to more than 240 families.
- Direct Educational Advocacy in Warren County Provided advocacy assistance to 8 families.
- Partnership with Families F.A.C.T. provided Parent Support Partner services to:
  - St. Charles County 730 Families
  - o Franklin County 390 Families
  - Lincoln County 179 Families
- Family Support Program F.A.C.T. provided services to 877 families that include an individual with a developmental disability in St. Charles, St. Louis, Warren, Jefferson Counties and St. Louis City.

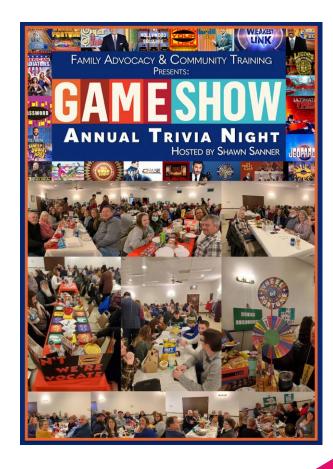
## **SUPPORTERS**
